Prayer and Liturgy



THIS SUNDAY'S READINGS:

Jeremiah 20:10-13

Psalms 69:8-10, 14, 17, 33-35

Romans 5:12-15

Matthew 10:26-33

In today's Gospel, Jesus tells us to fear those who try to destroy our souls and to place our trust in God who cares for us. St. Francis de Sales notes:

Everyone desires to embrace the good and fly from what is evil. When we experience an evil, we become sad and desire to free ourselves of this sadness. We are right to seek a means to get rid of this sadness. Fear and anxiety can come from an inordinate desire to be freed from a present difficulty or to realize a hoped-for goal.

Whenever you urgently hope to realize a certain good or to escape from a certain uneasiness, you must be especially careful to put your mind at rest and be at peace. When you see that you are becoming anxious, place yourself in God's presence. Resolve to do nothing that your desire insists on until your mind has regained peace. Be careful to make calm judgments based on the authentic values found in Jesus' teachings. Then try, without hurry, trouble, or anxiety, to accomplish your desire. Perform the action, not according to your desire, but reason.

When we seek to escape from our troubles, we must do so patiently, gently, and calmly. We must look to God for help rather than our own efforts. If we look to ourselves only, we will wear ourselves out. Walk simply in the way our Lord shows you and don't worry. Sing songs of praise and thanksgiving. Involve yourself in a variety of healthful activities. Also, revealing the cause of your anxiety to your confessor or a reliable person empowers you to find relief. If we always tend toward God's love, neither tribulation nor fear of future troubles will separate us from this love. Our love is founded on Jesus Christ, who cares for us and never betrays us. Great indeed is the confidence our Savior wants us to have in His care. All who trust in this confidence reap great fruit.

BLESSED LOUIS BRISSON, OSFS

Priest, Founder (June 23, 1817—February 2, 1908)

This past Friday, June 23, marks 200 years since the birth of Blessed Louis Brisson, OSFS. While one normally celebrates the Feast Day, which is October 12, it is fitting for us all to remember the work of Father Brisson and its impact on all of us. The following appears on the web page of the Oblates of St. Francis de Sales.



Louis Brisson, a priest of Troyes in France, founded the Oblates of St. Francis de Sales in 1876. As a diocesan priest, he was assigned as the full-time chaplain to the monastery of the Visitation of Holy Mary in Troyes. Mother Marie de Sales Chappuis, the superior of that community was convinced that it was, in fact, the will of God that their humble chaplain start a religious order of men to follow the spiritual legacy of St. Francis de Sales. He resisted.

However, the presence of God continued to stir within Fr. Brisson, climaxing in an apparition of Jesus Christ. This moment of prayer provided Fr. Brisson with the impetus to begin his work to gather men as Oblates of St. Francis de Sales. He also started, with St. Leonie Aviat, the founder of the Oblate Sisters of St. Francis de Sales, to redress the injustices of industrialization as it impacted poor girls in the urban districts of Troyes. Together, they began schools to ensure that these students would be protected from poverty and conscripted employment.

Since 1875, thousands of men in Europe, Africa, Asia and North and South America have joined the community. Oblates first arrived in the United States in 1893 and established a permanent community in 1903. The decision was made to form two American provinces - one headquartered in Wilmington, Delaware and one in Toledo, Ohio - in 1966.

Fr. Brisson was beatified, at the authorization of Pope Benedict XVI, on September 22, 2012, in Troyes, France. The cause for his canonization remains active.

The dream, inspiration and vision of Blessed Louis Brisson and Mother Marie de Sales Chappuis - embraced over and over again by each new member of the Community - is the ongoing story of the Oblates of St. Francis de Sales.

This story, through the grace of God, becomes the story of any disciple yearning to live Jesus.

As you enter the de Sales Chapel, there is a carved bust of Blessed Louis Brisson, OSFS that was donated to us by our sister parish, Niño Jesús, in Ecuador. To the right of the St. Joseph statue near the altar, a display cabinet holds a relic of Father Brisson, along with some materials which our priests brought home from the beautification ceremonies in Troyes. Please pray for his canonization.

June 24, our team of almost 40 teen and adult participants left for the Fredericksburg-Spotsylvania area to start a week-long opportunity for service work, helping perform home repair tasks for those less fortunate in this area. They will join over 800 others from the diocese, who will work, and pray together. All have been trained in tool use and safety procedures. For those who are attending for the first time, this may

well be a life-changing experience, as they see and meet the basic needs of their clients, and get a new appreciation for the gratitude they will receive in return. There will be daily morning Mass, long hours of hard work under the direction of adult contractors and crew leaders, and time to gather and even have some fun during evening programs. Please pray for the safety of all involved. We look forward to their return Friday afternoon, and will enjoy hearing all about their week of service and what it means to them.

Week 4: Public Policy and Immigration

Our Catholic teaching affirms the right of governments to defend their borders and to regulate migration. In the United States, however, a combination of deficiencies in our existing immigration laws and inconsistent enforcement of those laws has produced an untenable situation. There are millions of undocumented workers who have lived and worked here for years, begun families, and made the U.S. their home, but have no viable pathway to citizenship.


